

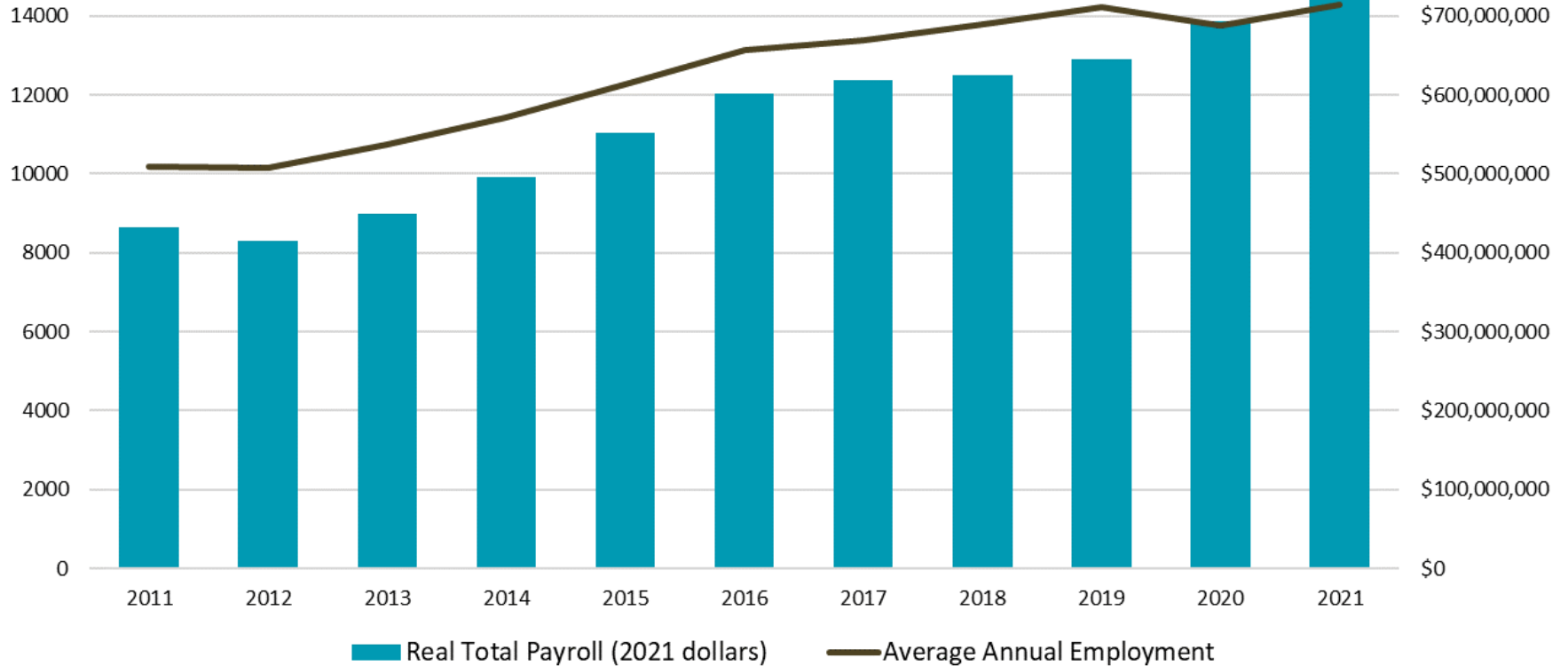

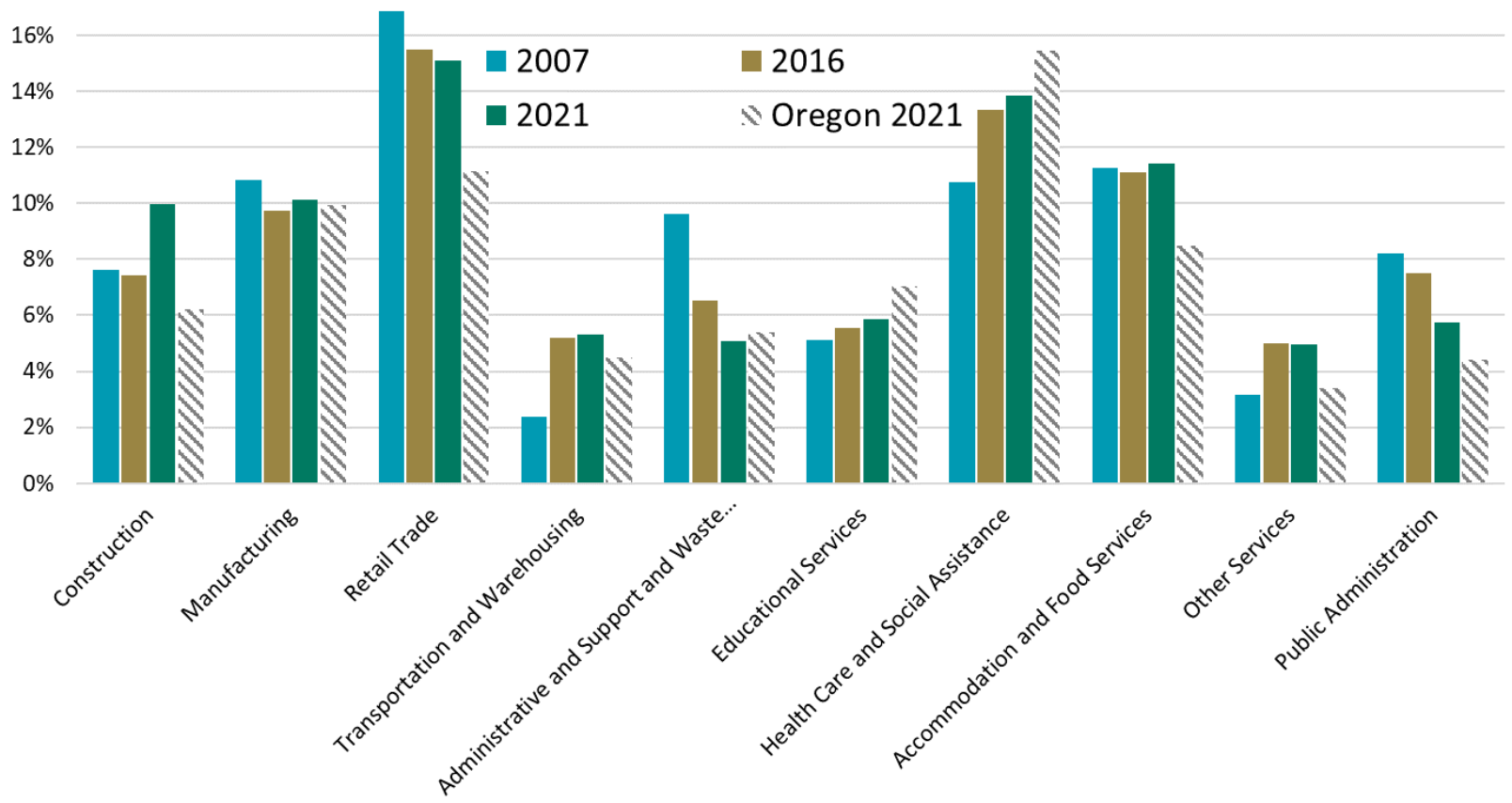

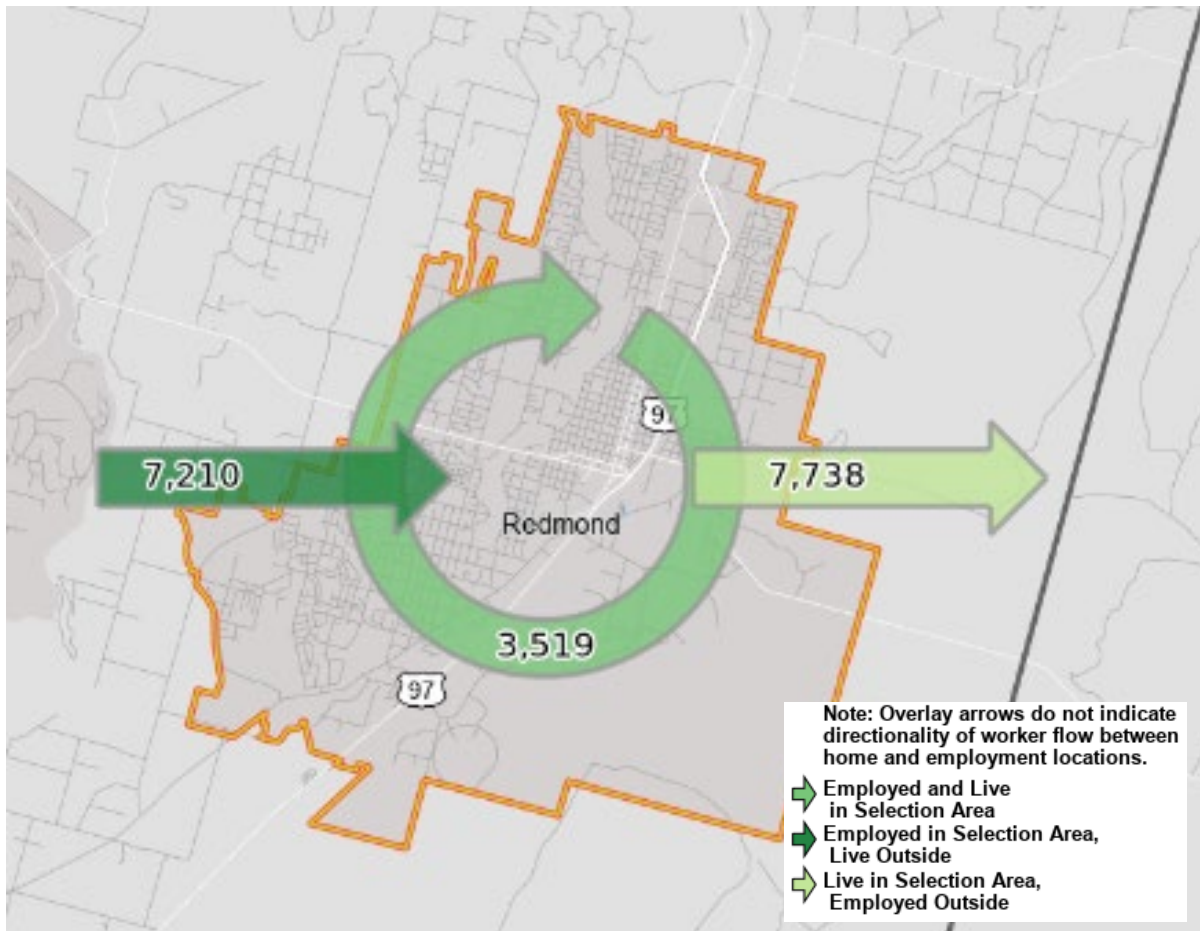


Solid Economic Growth in Redmond Over the Past Decade 70% in Real Payroll, 41% in Employment



Redmond Industry Employment Share Over Time & Compared to Oregon

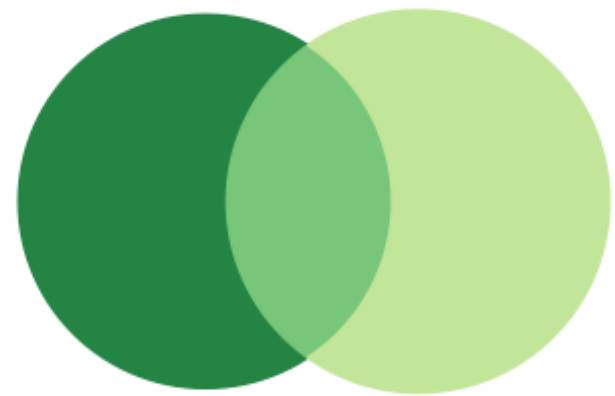




Note: Overlay arrows do not indicate directionality of worker flow between home and employment locations.

- ➔ Live in Selection Area, Employed Outside

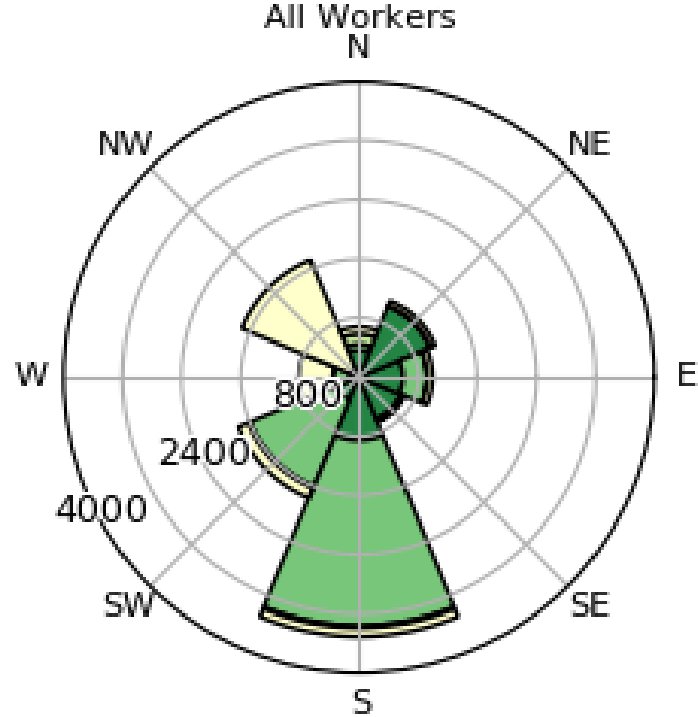
Inflow/Outflow Job Counts in 2019
