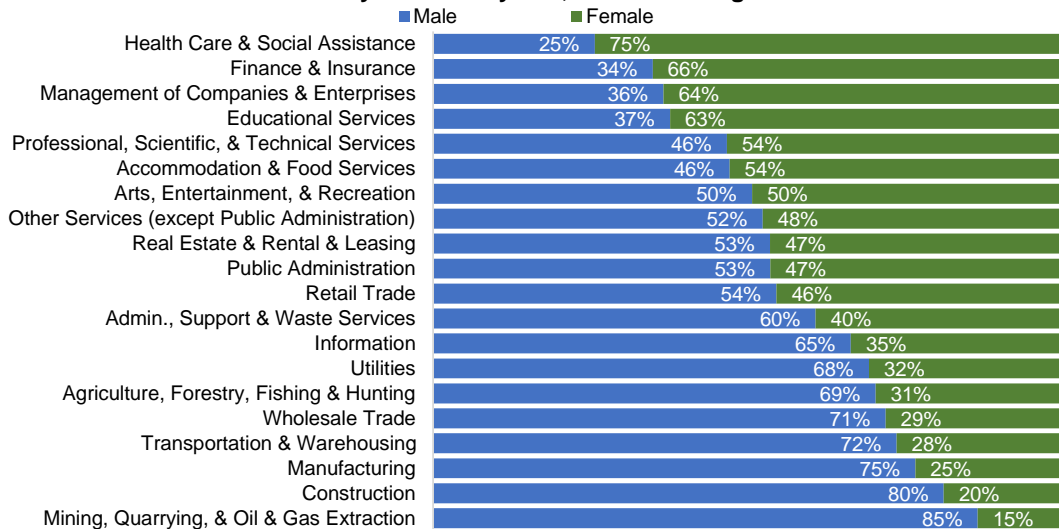


LANE COUNTY ECONOMIC INDICATORS

Graph of the Month: While women make up 50% of the Lane County workforce, the percentage varies widely by industry. Health care, finance and insurance, and education are dominated by women, while the opposite is true for transportation, natural resources, manufacturing and construction.
